- Steve Christy, Pima County Board Supervisor, District 4, talked about the following
 - Crisis nursing shortage. Have asked that the emergency committee be remobilized
 - Regional Transportation Authority is being controlled by a group that is funneling funds toward Tucson and away from other communities.
- Ambulance/Emergency Team: Received 12,500 calls in 2021. Ambulances being held up at Emergency Rooms for up to 2 hours due to hospital and emergency room shortage of personnel. This is means ambulances are not back in a timely manner to respond to subsequent calls.
- Police Department: Most recent scam is through text message. If you do not recognize a text, <u>delete it</u>. Do NOT open it. Do NOT try to "deactivate". This will cause the text to infiltrate. Missing resident John Hoff still missing. (Has been found)
